



Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure Report for Parents 2018 -19

What is the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG)?

The PPG provides schools with additional funding to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils. Those children who are registered as eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), (either currently or in the past); have been looked after by the Local Authority for 6 months or longer; have been adopted from care; or who have one or more parents currently serving in the Armed Forces.

Barriers to Learning:

- Attendance of a few individuals.
- Learning behaviour of a few individuals.
- Access to high quality resources.
- Highly effective home / school support.
- Access to high quality adult support, when it is needed, as often as possible.
- Ability to engage in all aspects of school life equally.
- Social, Emotional and Mental health needs.

Our Key Objectives

- Include all children in all curriculum activities, targeted to their individual needs.
- Provide intervention at the point of teaching (or as close as possible) providing all children with the best chance to achieve their full potential.
- Ensure that all school adults are highly trained and that practice is current and of a high quality.
- Provide high quality resources to support home learning.
- Support all children as academic and social learners.
- Promote and identify all children who are eligible for pupil premium through FSM as soon as possible.
- Provide efficient support for families, socially and academically, to enable them to support children's achievement.

Support Provided:

The Pupil Premium Grant was spent in the following ways:

- Staffing to provide small group support in English and Maths.
- Resources for support groups.
- Staffing to provide social inclusion, including SEN support, nurture and advice.
- Training for all staff to provide high quality phonics, spelling, writing and maths support.
- Credit to provide social inclusion on trips etc.
- Specialist outside agency support, including assessments and advice to teaching staff.
- Support for Y2 and Y6 to enable all children to access and achieve in statutory tests.

How we Measure the Impact of the Support:

- Test results monitored and used to plan interventions at least termly.
- Pupil attendance is monitored termly.
- Annual parental surveys.
- Termly reports to Governors.
- School data tracking systems used to monitor progress regularly.
- Early help meetings, Pupil Passport reviews and pupil progress meetings held at least termly.
